Remembrance Sunday

Regrettably, due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, Remembrance Sunday will be very different this year. The Government and the Church of England have made it clear that any Acts of Remembrance must be kept to a small number of people and a short length of time. Below is the planned course of action, subject to change if we are put into a higher tier or lockdown.

There will be a short Act of Remembrance at the Shrine at 10.55am on Sunday 8th November. The Act of Remembrance will be officially attended by six Representatives and will consist of an opening prayer; the reading of the names of the fallen; the laying of wreaths; the two-minute silence and the Blessing.

If others wish to pass by and spectate that is permissible, but everyone must observe social distancing, the Rule of Six and disperse quickly once the Act of Remembrance has finished. Please note the road will **not** be closed, as in previous years and there will be no service in church beforehand.

As an alternative this year you may prefer to pay your respects by observing the silence on your doorstep or tuning into the service at the Cenotaph, which has also been reduced in numbers.

We can still honour those who have died and been injured in war, but let us do so safely, protecting ourselves and one another.

Rector's Letter October 2020



November is traditionally a month for remembrance and while things will be different this year we can still honour those we have known and loved, but who are sadly no longer with us.

Once a year, in one of the benefice churches, we usually hold a Memorial Service for those who have lost a loved one. Sadly this won't happen this year but there will be an opportunity for you to light a candle in church on Saturday 31st October between 9.30am -10.30am. This is the time the church is open for private prayer, and all are welcome. Social distancing and hygiene regulations are in place and face coverings must be worn.

Remembrance Sunday will also be different this year. Following Government Regulations the Act of Remembrance will be much shorter and officially attended by only a small number of people. As always we will honour the fallen of Ecton with the greatest respect but you may feel it more appropriate this year to observe the two-minute silence on your doorstep or by watching the service from the Cenotaph at home.

However we remember those we have lost, let us always remember their good examples and commit to living our lives in ways that honour their memory.

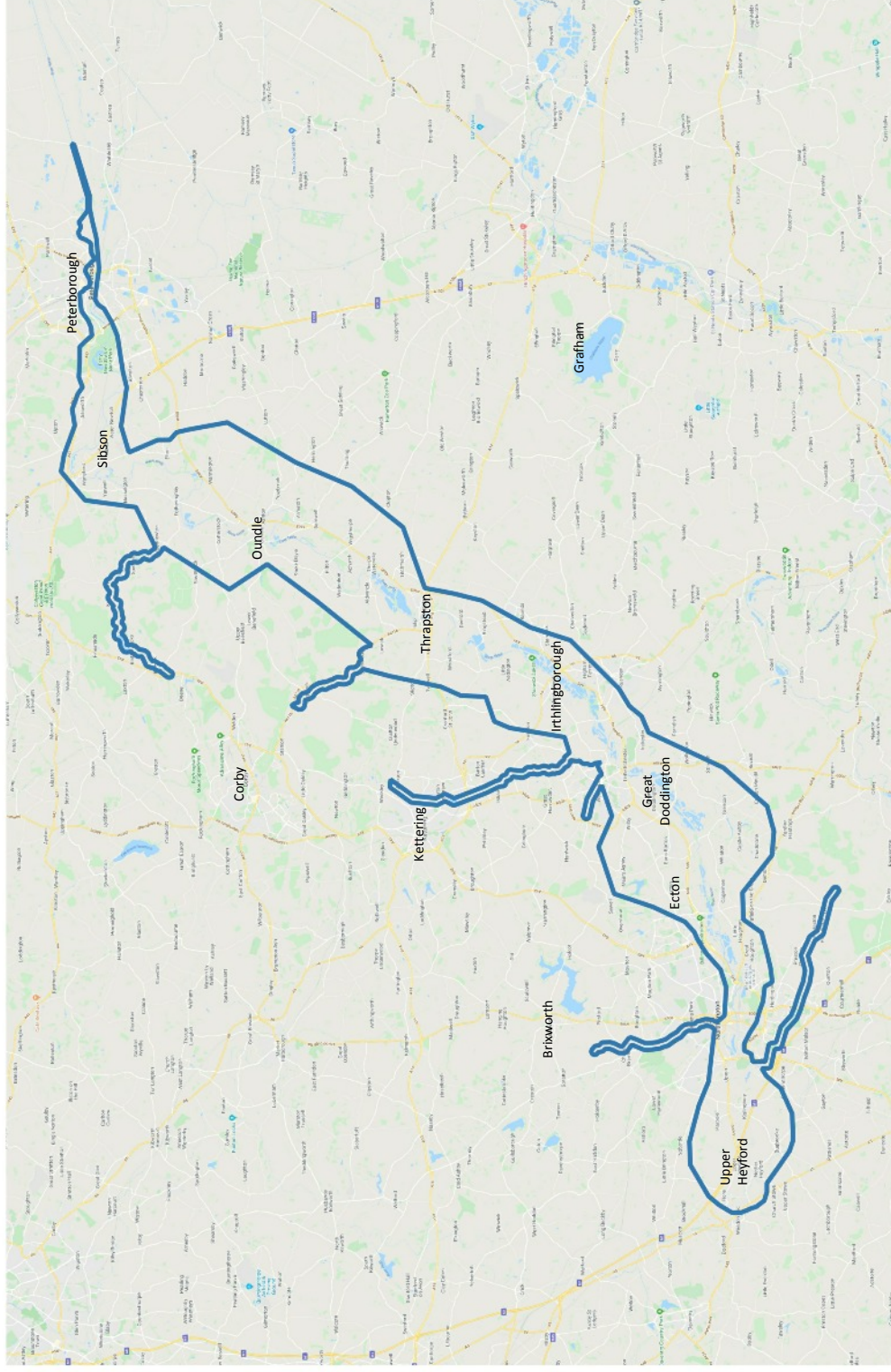

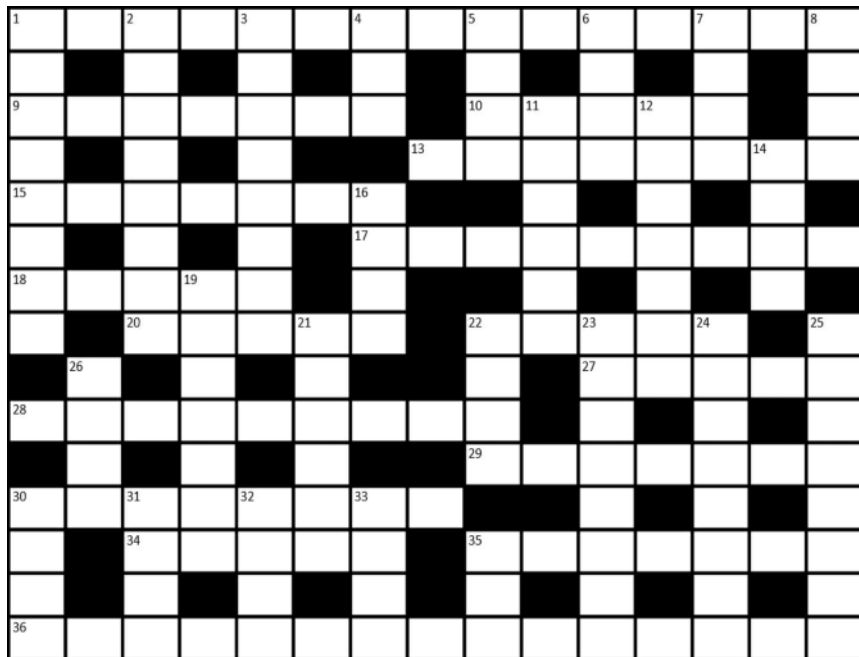
