Rector's Letter April 2026



On Wednesday 25th March 2026 Bishop Sarah Mullally was installed as the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury. This was an historic occasion, with Bishop Sarah becoming the first woman to hold the position. Historically known as an enthronement, the Installation marks the symbolic start of the Archbishop of Canterbury's public ministry in the Church of England and across the Anglican Communion.

As Archbishop of Canterbury she is the most senior bishop in the Church of England, with a public role in guiding the Church and contributing to national life. She is also an ecumenical leader, building relationships with other Christian traditions in the UK and around the world. In addition, she is a significant inter-religious leader, working with other faith communities to promote understanding, support dialogue and respond to moments of tension at home and overseas.

During the service, among other items, Archbishop Mullally was presented with her pastoral staff (shaped like a shepherd's crook), a symbol of her role as a shepherd of God's people. She wore the cope (a long, highly decorated cloak) and mitre (a tall hat which folds flat when not in use) that were commissioned when she was first consecrated as a bishop and as a symbol of the close ties with the Roman Catholic Church she wore the pastoral ring given to Archbishop Michael Ramsey in Rome by Pope Paul VI, in 1966. This had been specially fitted for her by the Crown Jeweller.

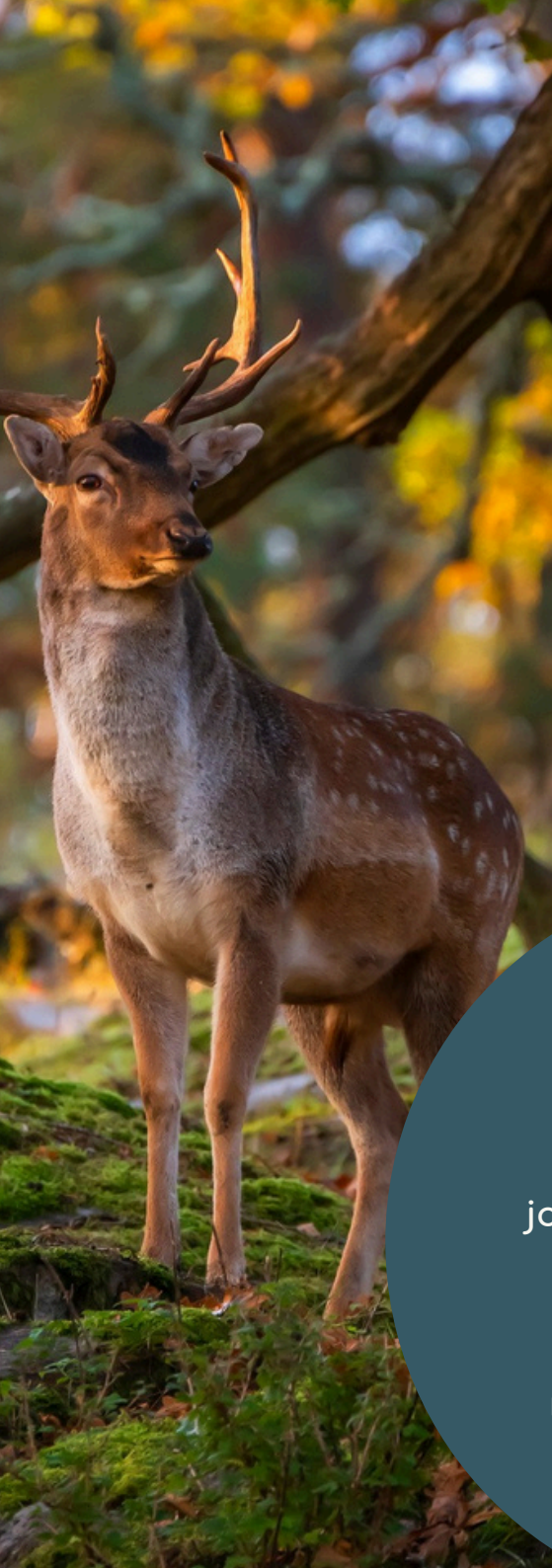

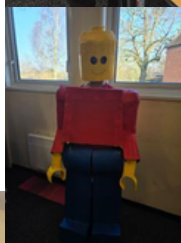

So much resilience was shown in the lesson!

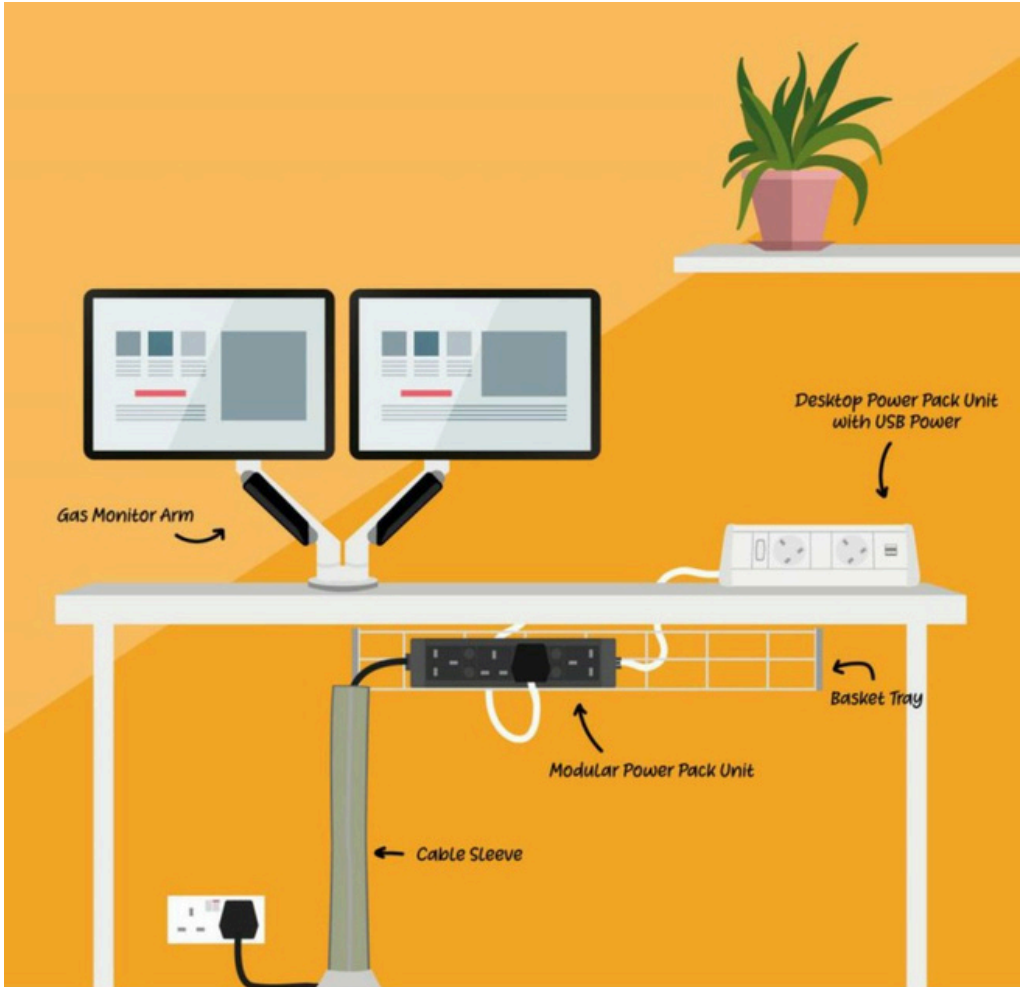

Ecton History Group

Ecton - a Brief History

Ecton has a rich history that stretches back over a thousand years.

The name “Ecton” comes from Old English and is thought to mean “Ecca’s farm or settlement,” reflecting its Anglo-Saxon origins. The village is recorded in the Domesday Book of 1086, Ecton was a rural farming village, centred on the manor and surrounding agricultural land. The parish church of St Mary Magdalene, dating back to the 13th century.

Ecton also supported a range of traditional trades over the centuries, including blacksmithing, baking, and tailoring. A bell foundry operated here in the late 17th century, and nearby ironworking contributed to the local economy in later years. Like many villages, Ecton was once largely self-sufficient, with most residents living and working locally.

One of Ecton’s most notable historical connections is to Benjamin Franklin. His family lived in the village for over 300 years, many working as blacksmiths. Franklin himself visited Ecton in 1758 while researching his ancestry.

Through the 18th and 19th centuries, Ecton remained a working rural community. In the 20th century, however, the village gradually became more residential, with traditional trades declining and local shops eventually closing. Despite these changes, Ecton was one of the first villages in Northamptonshire to be designated a conservation area.

Today, Ecton is a small, friendly community, valued for its peaceful setting, historic buildings, and strong sense of identity. While it has adapted to modern life, it continues to reflect its long history and rural roots.

Local Birds Of Prey

We have our fair share of birds of prey in and around Ecton and Red Kites made national news because of their breeding success locally. So much so that 120, mostly from Northamptonshire, have been collected for return to Spain to help rebuild their population.

Red Kites don't always seem obviously red, but are easily identifiable by their forked, tapered, wedge-shaped tails. When soaring their wing tips are held out flat. Now so common that seeing more than one at a time is a regular occurrence.



They generally scavenge and feed on carrion.



Sparrowhawks are not so common, but it appears that one or two have made Ecton a regular visiting spot. They swoop in and hit their targets out of nowhere, often taking small birds from our bird table. If a garden that is normally full of birds is suddenly quiet and empty, it is probably the presence of a sparrowhawk. If they swoop and miss, they usually perch for a few minutes before setting off again.

They have very staring yellow eyes, yellow legs, and horizontal dark bars on their tail feathers.

Buzzards have a bulkier body and hold their wings in a shallow V when soaring. The tail feathers are more of a straight-ish rectangle than a wedge shape. They can sometimes be heard making a cat-like mewing cry.



They tend to eat carrion, small birds and small mammals, even worms.



Kestrels are frequently seen hovering over roadside verges (their other name is Windhover). The verges on the A4500 between Ecton and past Earls Barton a common area to spot them. It is the hovering whilst hunting for small mammals that distinguishes them.

Their incredible UV eyesight allows them to identify tell-tale lines of fresh urine left by mice and voles before suddenly plummeting to catch their prey.
