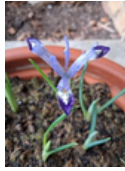

# Rector's Letter February 2026



Each autumn, taking inspiration from the television programme *Gardeners' World*, I set some iris bulbs. I plant them in a shallow bowl, placing them in a sheltered spot, as instructed. Nothing much happens until after Christmas, but then, regardless of what the weather is like, they shoot and grow and are one of the first spring bulbs to flower. Their delicate mauve and yellow blooms brightening even the dullest day, this being the reason the presenter Monty Don gives the advice to set them. The other day our first iris flowered, giving me a real boost on what was a dark, cold January day.

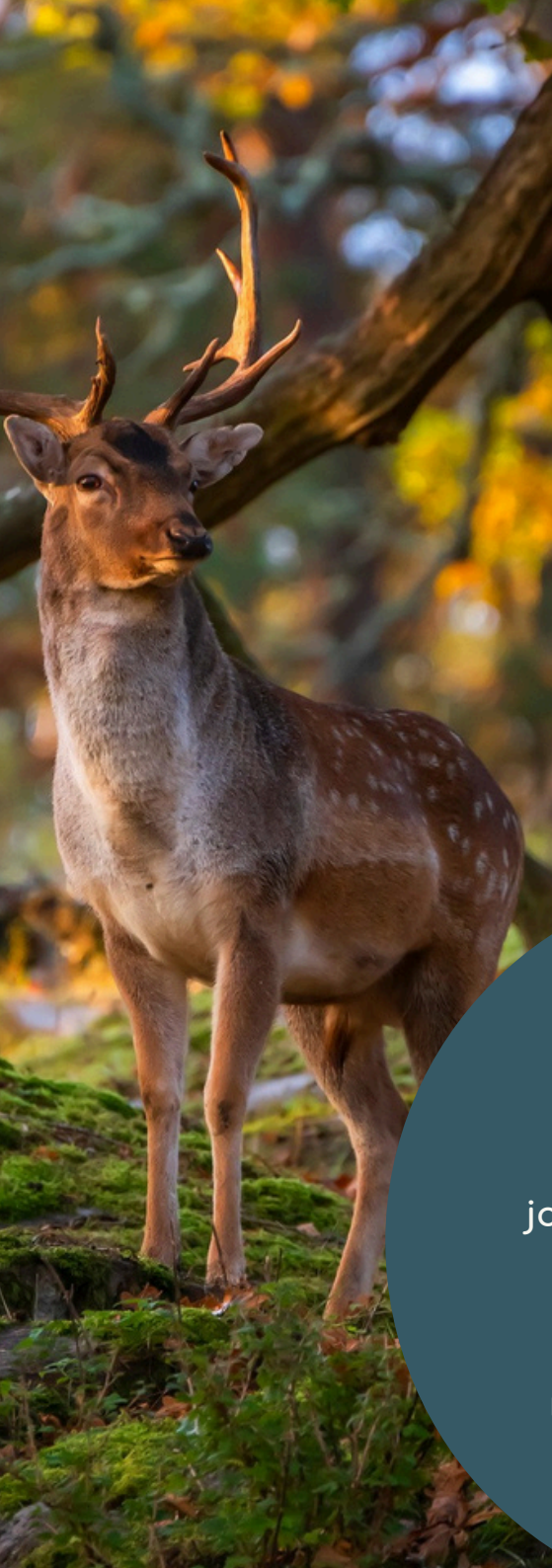
As we enter into the month of February, in the church year we are moving towards Lent, a season which begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year is on 18<sup>th</sup> February. The season of Lent, a period of 40 days (46 if you include Sundays) reminds us of the time Jesus spent in the wilderness before his ministry began. At the end of Lent we move into Holy Week and by the time we reach Easter Day on 5<sup>th</sup> April, everything will be lighter and more colourful, as spring will be upon us and we celebrate Jesus risen from the dead.

Just as spring bulbs need a time of darkness and cold in order to produce their flowers, so Jesus endured the darkness of Good Friday to rise to new life and it is heartening to think that by the time Easter comes our gardens and community spaces will be bursting with new life, reminding us of the new life that God offers to us through His Son Jesus.

So, as we make our way through the month of February and begin the season of Lent, let us hold onto the promise of light and new life to come, both in the natural world and through the Christian faith.

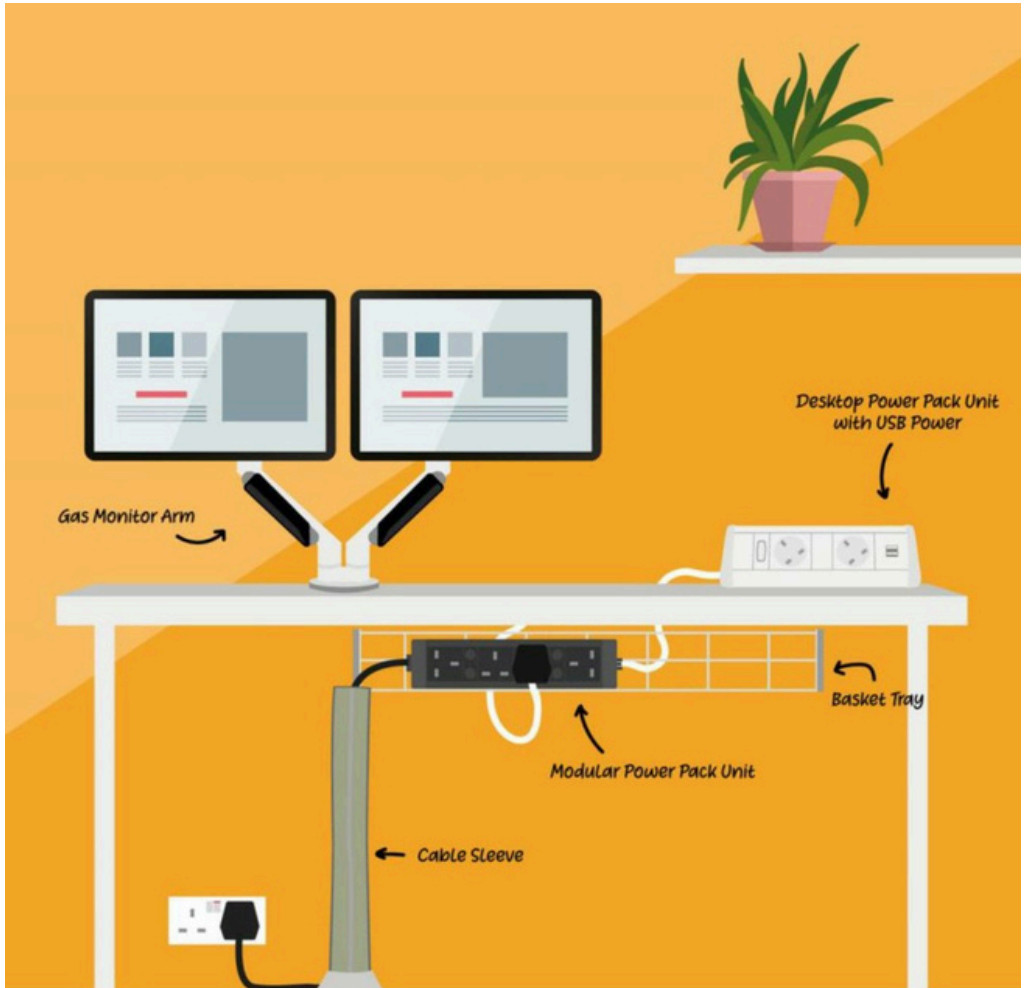

# Ecton History Group

## Proposed Village Project - Ecton Heritage Trail

At our last meeting we discussed creating an Ecton Heritage Trail, this would consist of a short self-guided walking route, entirely within the village, for people to enjoy at their own pace, that will highlight Ecton's History, Interesting Buildings & Community Life.

The trail will focus on features many of us pass every day - Traditional Stone Buildings, Former Village Buildings such as Chapels, Shops and Tradesman's Houses as well as the Parish Church. Using photographs and stories contributed by local residents, we hope the trail will help explain how Ecton has developed over time.

Information can be shared by a printed leaflet of the Heritage route, a small number of agreed interpretation panels and possibly additional online material accessed by QR codes.

The aim of the project is to preserve local history, encourage walking and exploration, support education & strengthen pride in Ecton's rich heritage. Ultimately this would be community-led and local residents are invited to contribute memories, photographs and ideas as the project develops. Anyone interested in getting involved or contributing material will be very welcome.

As part of our ongoing research we are currently looking into the Oldest House in the Village (apart from the Church) and the old cottages that stood where the Sunnyside Flats now stand, any old photographs or memories of who lived and worked there would be most welcome - Wendy - email - [ectonhistory@outlook.com](mailto:ectonhistory@outlook.com) or message me 07986 557773

**What was the first record you bought?**

Elvis's Golden Hits which is generally accepted as the first Greatest Hits Album. I bought it in a Record shop in Corby and it cost approx. £2.50p. In those days the record shops had booths and you could listen to the record before you bought it. When I bought singles my friends and I would ask to listen to about five or six different records and then buy the one we wanted. Fell out of love with Elvis very quickly (At the risk of upsetting all Elvis's fans) as he morphed from the worlds first great Rock and Roll singer into a middle of the road crooner who made poor films. A complete waste of his talent!!!!

**Is there a record or tune that reminds you of a particular time in your life?**

It has to be A Whiter Shade of Pale by Procal Harum. One of a small number of singles to sell over 12 million copies. Has a fantastic introduction but I still haven't the faintest idea what the song is about but it always reminds me of my very happy and carefree college days full of fun and minimal studying!

**Favourite female singer and song?** I am a huge fan of Kylie especially her later stuff when she grew out of S. A.+ W. But my favourite female singer is and always has been Ella Fitzgerald. My favourite song is Miss Otis Regrets.

**Favourite male singer and song?** It has to be the great Van Morrison. Favourite song is Here Comes the Night by Them. Van is the lead singer. Have never tired of the song.

**Favourite Band?** Favourite band is Dire Straits who I have seen live on a number of occasions. Their concerts were always fantastic. Honourable mention for Chris Rea who sadly died just before Christmas.

# Local Birds Of Prey

We have our fair share of birds of prey in and around Ecton and Red Kites made national news because of their breeding success locally. So much so that 120, mostly from Northamptonshire, have been collected for return to Spain to help rebuild their population.

Red Kites don't always seem obviously red, but are easily identifiable by their forked, tapered, wedge-shaped tails. When soaring their wing tips are held out flat. Now so common that seeing more than 1 at a time is a regular occurrence.

They generally scavenge and feed on carrion.



Sparrowhawks are not so common, but it appears that one or two have made Ecton a regular visiting spot. They swoop in and hit their targets out of nowhere, often taking small birds from our bird table. If a garden that is normally full of birds is suddenly quiet and empty, it is probably the presence of a sparrowhawk. If they swoop and miss, they usually perch for a few minutes before setting off again.

They have very staring yellow eyes, yellow legs, and horizontal dark bars on their tail feathers.

Buzzards have a bulkier body and hold their wings in a shallow V when soaring. The tail feathers are more of a straight-ish rectangle than a wedge shape. They can sometimes be heard making a cat-like mewing cry.

They tend to eat carrion, small birds and small mammals, even worms.



Kestrels are frequently seen hovering over roadside verges (their other name is Windhover). The verges on the A4500 between Ecton and past Earls Barton a common area to spot them. It is the hovering whilst hunting for small mammals that distinguishes them.

Their incredible UV eyesight allows them to identify tell-tale lines of fresh urine left by mice and voles before suddenly plummeting to catch their prey.
